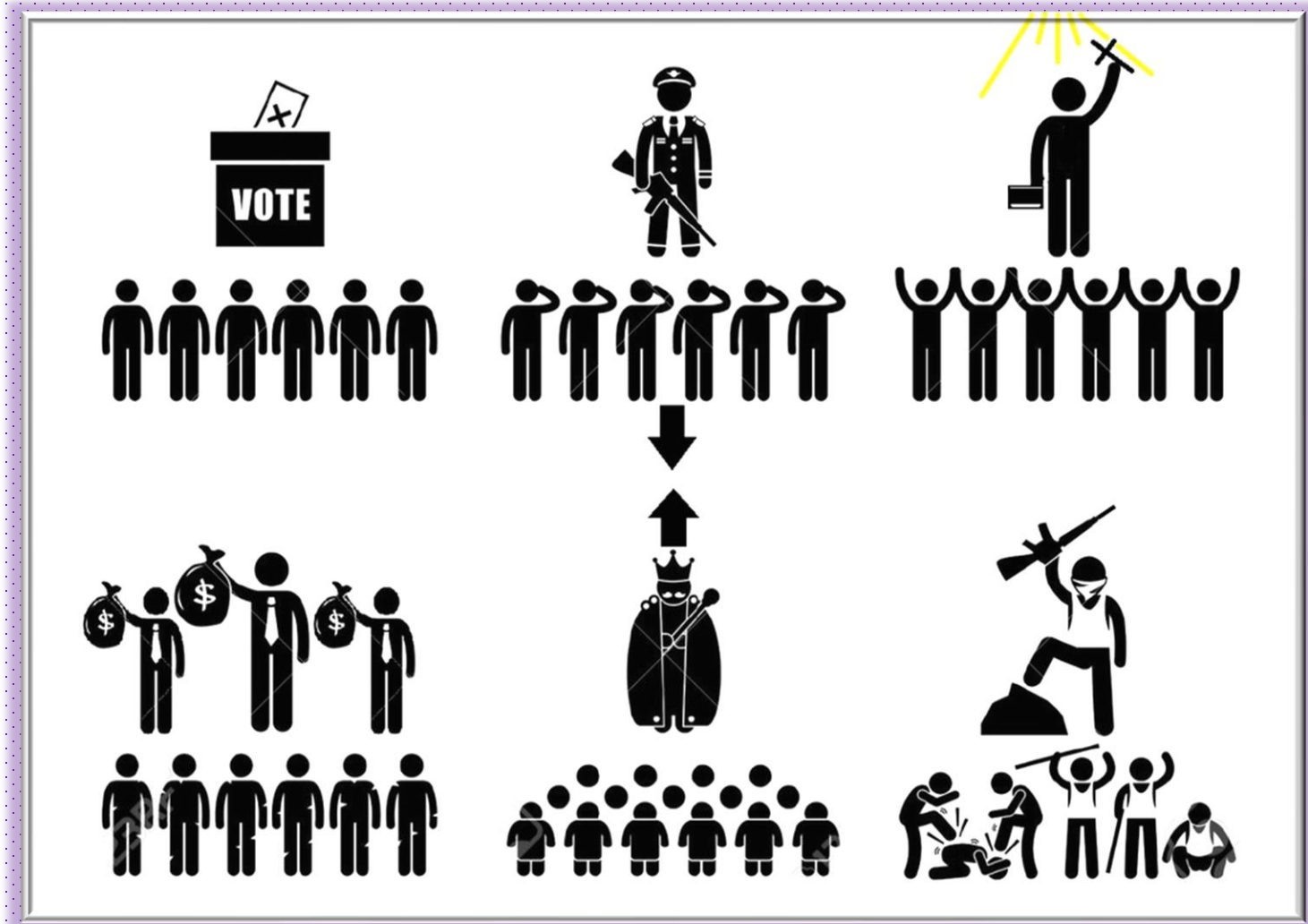

What is democracy?

- Democracy literally means, ruled by the people. The term is derived from the Greek dēmokratia, which was coined from dēmos (“people”) and kratos (“rule”) in the middle of the 5th century BC to denote the political systems then existing in some Greek city-states, notably Athens.

Types Of Democracy

DEMOCRACY

DIRECT: forms of direct participation of citizens in democratic decision making, in contrast to indirect or representative democracy.

REPRESENTATIVE: This means that the government is elected by citizens. Citizens vote for their government officials and these officials represent the citizens' ideas and concerns in government.

CONSTITUTIONAL: the authority of the majority is limited by legal and institutional means so that the rights of individuals and minorities are respected

MONITORY: a phase of democracy characterised by instruments of public monitoring and scrutinizing of government power.

Legislature: an organized body of **persons having the power to** make laws for a political unit.

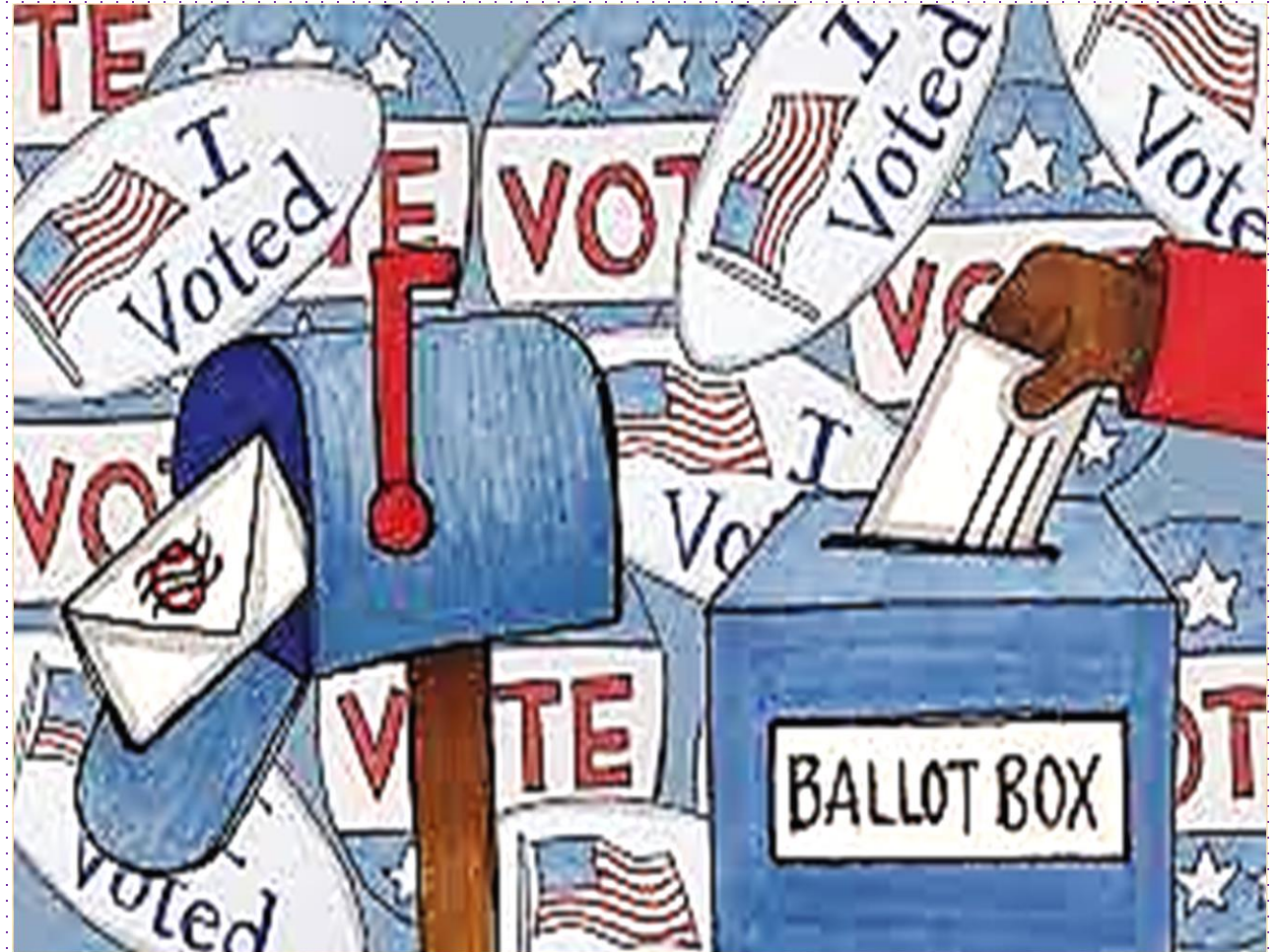
Executive: the **executive branch of a government** eg. the person or persons who constitute the executive magistracy of a state.

Judiciary: the system of law courts that administer justice and constitute the judicial branch of government

Media: the means of communication, as radio and television, newspapers, magazines, and the internet, that reach or influence people widely
