- ➤ The Greek education system is administered by the **Ministry of National Education and Religious Affairs**. By law, all children between **5 and 15** years of age are required to attend school.
- The schooling system in Greece is divided into the following levels:
- > Pre-school education (4-5 years of age)
- **Primary education** (6-12 years of age).
- Lower secondary education (13-15 years of age).
- ➤ Upper secondary education (16-18 years of age).
- After finishing *gymnasio*, children also have the option of attending a more practically focused **Technical and Vocational Lyceum**.
- In their final year of school, students sit the Pan-Hellenic National University Entry Exams which determine their eligibility for tertiary studies.

SCHOOLS IN GREECE

- The school year in Greece begins on the 11th of September and ends in mid-June for primary schools and at the end of June for secondary schools.
- Final exams for secondary schools begin at the end of May.
- There is a **two-week holiday** at both **Christmas** (23d of December to 7th or January) and **Easter** (a week before Easter and one after Easter)

HIGHER EDUCATION

THE GREEK EDUCATION SYSTEM

- Approximately 95% of children in Greece attend public schools.
- Both public and private schools are closely overseen by the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs, which dictates the school curriculum.
- For public schools the Ministry also decides on the available funding and staff appointments.
- ➤ Public schools do not charge fees and have traditionally provided free textbooks to students.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

- There are just over 20 **universities in Greece**, spread across the country and all within the **public sector**.
- While teaching is mainly in **Greek**, specialized study programs are also available in other languages (most commonly English), at both undergraduate and postgraduate level.
- These universities are joined by 16 **Technological Educational Institutes** (TEIs), which offer higher education programs with a focus on practical and professional skills, in subjects such as applied technology, healthcare, agriculture, management and art and design.
- Overall Greece's higher education system is well-respected, ranked 41st in the world in the first edition of the
- QS Higher Education System Strength Rankings.
